January is Poverty Awareness Month: True or False: The rate of child poverty in America is higher than it is in most of the world's industrialized countries.

TRUE> in fact, the US child poverty rate is two-to-three times higher than other major industrialized nations. According to the latest comparative numbers, the child poverty rate in Sweden in recent years has been less than 6%, France, 7%, Germany 10%, Australia and Japan, 12%, Canada 14%, while, in the US the child poverty rate has remained at over 16% for the past 2 years – with some sources placing the comparative number at more the 23% of all children in America living in poverty.

- 37 Million Americans live in poverty, that's more than the population of California.
- A full-time job at the federal minimum wage (\$5.15) cannot keep a family of three out of poverty.
- Many of the low-wage jobs created by the economy do not pay enough for a household to afford even a modest one-bedroom rental anywhere in the country.
- Cleveland, OH ranked 9th (38%) in the list of top ten cities with the highest child poverty in the U.S.
